June Meeting

Glenn Matherne and William Sellers demonstrated Garage Band o8 at the June Meeting. They did a great job showing how Garage Band could be used to mix a recording session. Because Garage Band allows you to add and remove tracks you can move tracks between multiple takes or you can play each instrument one at a time until you build the final production. As they showed off the capabilities of Garage Band, it became obvious that the program is a great way to make recordings of bands for "demo tapes." Wow -- a product that is actually good at what it was originally intended to do.

I really enjoyed seeing to musicians utilize Garage Band in the way it was intended to be used (not to mention all the odd things you can do with it to just have fun).

Thanks Glenn and William for your presentation. The work y'all did in advance really showed.

AAPL

AAPL has been up and down a lot in the last month. Strangely it is a little over a dollar higher than it was a month ago. It closed at \$173.88 today with a Market Cap of \$153.3 billion. It is still just under \$30 a share less than its 52-week high of \$202.96 (15%). As a point of reference, Microsoft is down \$4 a share compared to a month ago and \$12.35 a share down compared to its 52-week high (49%). Microsoft's Market Cap was just under \$250 billion at this high but is currently at \$234 billion.

From this perspective, AAPL looks wonderful. If the new iPhone continues to do well, I expect to see the stock continue to rise -- I am guessing about \$10 over the next month (this is just a total guess and I am not a licensed broker, so don't bet on this advice). But you know, things just look positive right now.

iPhone 3G

The new iPhone is faster, thinner, cheaper and has lots of new software features. Sounds perfect!

Apparently a bunch of folks thinks so -- a million of them! In the first 3 days of sales, the new iPhone sold over 1 million units. That is just amazing to me.

As when the iPhone was originally released, quite a number of people had trouble activating their AT&T phone service on their new phone. As the weekend wore on, AT&T apparently got more servers up and began to meet the demand.

Quite a bit of data has surfaced about sales of the new iPhone. For example, 29% of the original iPhone purchasers were PC users compared to 39% for the new iPhone. For the original iPhone, only 48% already had AT&T phone plans compared to 62% for the iPhone 3G.

I found the country by country counts very interesting. Here are a few of the counts: USA 400K, UK 250K, Italy 88K, Mexico 69K, Germany 48K, Spain 31K and Japan 25K.

Many Apple Stores were sold out before the weekend ended.

App Store

The App Store seemed to have had a good weekend also with over 10 million downloads. The store opened with close to 250 applications available. Games in the \$5-10 range dominated the paid download market. The average price per download was \$5.47.

Knowing that a lot of these had to come from new iPhone 3G customers, it sure looks like the App Store may well become a great little cash cow for Apple (maybe I should up my guesstimate for AAPL's price next month...).

Since the App Store just opened, it is very likely that the number of applications will increase substantially in the next few

months. The questions that remain to be answered are: Will people continue to buy applications at a profitable rate? Will the applications be solid or will the iPhone develop a reputation as buggy because of crashing applications?

BRMUG Picnic

The time is coming around for BRMUG's Annual Picnic. We are planning the Picnic for September 7th. This is a Sunday (working around LSU's home football schedule).

The picnic is a lot of fun. Our menu normally includes: BBQ Chicken, hot dogs, potato salad, baked beans, corn on the cob and colas.



At some point I will miss not having the original CD (the better quality sound). At some point I will find another reason to complain. For now, \$20 has provided me almost every track these two groups ever recorded. COOL! I hope Rhapsody keeps this up for a little bit longer. There are a few more bargains that I want.
