After everything was said and done (with Another month has gone by. Apple's 3 month stock chart looks pretty good -- not spectacular, but pretty good. Looking over the last 3 months, Apple has had reasonable gains with a fair amount of ups and downs in there. What surprised me was to notice that the high on Friday (\$46.22) was Apple's 52-week high. In fact, it was the highest value in Apple's history! From that perspective, these

must have been some very good months. But in fact, they do not appear to have been great. The transition from Power architecture to Intel is still a research topic. No major software or hardware announcements have happened recently. And yet, Apple just hit their highest ever stock price. Maybe it is time to start wearing our sunglasses at night...

Apple finally did it -- they gave into the multi-button mouse. That is right. Apple now has a mouse with more than one button -- sort of. 

generation it can tell if you are pushing on the right or left side and sends a corresponding left click or right click. Simple. Elegant. Just what you would expect from Apple. The top of the mouse is different though. Right where a scroll wheel would be on many modern mice, Apple has inserted a small trackball that acts as a vertical, horizontal and diagonal scroll wheel. Preliminary reactions have been phenomenal. And yes, the trackball can be pressed down to act as a third button. But Apple went a step further. Remember those odd semi-circle plastic pieces on the sides of your mouse? I remember spending quite a bit of time trying to figure out what they were before giving up and writing them off as an odd way to mesh the two halves together. Apple has turned the pair into a 4th button -- squeezing them (either one or both) produces a 4th click that can be configured to perform an action.

The early response is very positive. In fact, the only complaints have been a desire for a more flexible utility to associate actions with each button press (a shareware solution already exists) and a universal question of when the Bluetooth versions arrive. Most assume that after the USB Mighty Mouse sales slow, Apple will unveil a Bluetooth version.

At \$49, the Mighty Mouse is flying out of Apple Stores. You might wonder what I think (since I seem to have an opinion on everything). The idea of the Mighty Mouse is much more important than the mouse itself. Apple has supported multi-button mice for years (I have been using a Logitech scroll mouse for a long time -- I never even used the mouse that came with my G5). The fact that Apple redesigned a scroll mouse and did such a great job is not surprising (but it is very welcome).

What the Mighty Mouse means to me is the future of the laptop. iBooks and PowerBooks should be revamped to include multi-button trackpads (the trackpad already does scroll-wheel emulation). This is exciting to me. The biggest single complaint I have about the PowerBook (applies to iBook also) is the dexterity required to properly use Safari (and other applications). I command-click or control-click more than I click (or would if my fingers were more coordinated). Apple has

### Dashboard Widgets

Dashboard and its widgets have continued to grow. Over 1000 widgets have now been released.

And for those of us that have memory concerns, solutions have come out that disable Dashboard or minimize its

impact on system performance.

First, you can disable all widgets and then restart the Dock. This reduces the cpu and memory resource consumption of Dashboard.

Macosxhints has a number of articles about Dashboard including a script to enable and disable Dashboard (search on dashboard).
