

iPod product line so that it looked logical and the price/performance balance of each model worked together.

And now the iPod Mini is gone. It has been replaced with the iPod Nano. And yes the iPod Nano is smaller, a lot smaller than the mini. The iPod Nano is 3.5" tall, 1.6" wide and 0.27" thick. It has a color display and a clickwheel and supports photos like its bigger brothers. The iPod Nano come is 2 GB (\$199) and 4 GB (\$249) and in black or white. The iPod Nano does not use a hard drive, it is flash based.

With the iPod Nano web site, a new section showed up called Car Integration. This page lists the various car manufacturers that already support or will support the iPod soon.

The iPod Nano is just another iPod. It is incredibly small and is even better for use while exercising than the Mini was. Prior to the the iPod Nano, you had to choose between the reliability of the Shuffle and the greater storage capacity of the Mini. The iPod Nano has eliminated the need for compromise (okay, you may still need to compromise becasue of price). The iPod Nano looks like another unbelievably successful model in the iPod family.

iTunes 5

iTunes 5 has been released. It includes a new look (the brushed metal is not there). iTunes 5 includes support for the MotoROKR phone and the iPod Nano.

Apple added a link to the iTunes Music Store so that people can donate to the Red Cross for Katrina relief.

QuickTime 7.0.2 Released

And then along came Katrina. It was just another hurricane. A very powerful one, but still just a hurricane.

I saw a picture that explained a lot for me. It was a picture of a pice of plywood over a window in New Orleans. It had the names and the dates of the last 4 or 5 hurricanes. It include Katrina and '05.

Until I saw this picture I did not understand the people who did not leave. After Camille, and Frederick, and Andrew I have reached the point where I believe you decide the risk level and you leave if the level is too high. Based on information, Baton Rouge did not look like it would be too be bad. I am sure I would have left New Orleans if I lived there.

But then that picture became eloquent as my mind looked at it. I can easily see people going through the same steps they have over and over again. It had become routine. We have had quite a number of hurricanes in Louisiana in recent years without any major problems. So preparing for a


hurricane was a process. No one ever thought beyond it. No one ever thought about what if it actually hits. What if it turns out real bad?

We prepared for a normal hurricane with a normal amount damage, and with a normal recovery period.

Katrina turned out to be abnormal. It flattened the coast east of New Orleans. It weakened things enough in New Orleans, that a few days later the flooding began. And instead of dealing with the death of some people, we are now trying to grasp the meaning of the death of a city. And not just any city -- New Orleans.

So, like the rest of Baton Rouge, I am trying to deal with my emotions. I really do not know what I am feeling. One side of me is very aware of all the suffering, pain and loss. Another side of me can hardly fathom all the different kinds of support and all the different people and groups that have helped in the aftermath of Katrina. I hope that each of you are safe.
