This product has made it possible for amateurs and professionals to produce their own music without astronomical investment. I, for one, hope GarageBand helps many artists avoid being at the mercy of the large recording labels.

#### AAPL

Interesting times continue. After a few months of decline, Apple was starting back up the Wall Street elevator. Things were starting to look good.

And along came the questions about stock options. At first it appeared that Apple's proactive effort might prevent any major impact. But the press just kept talking about it. And so it is a question now. And will remain so until the investigations are all done and final rulings are made. In other words expect this to become a big story every time Apple starts looking up in the near future.

A month ago Apple had bottomed out at just over \$50 a share. This month they peaked at just under \$70 a share (\$19 spread). Currently they are at \$64. This is still a healthy increase over a month ago. Yes, 38% is a pretty good jump in one month, even if it has leveled out a mere 27% increase as of today.

And yes, I believe things are going to get better. The Intel transition has



been very successful. Apple can now turn its attention to innovation again -- rather than concentrating on not losing anything. All things considered, a year of transition is not bad at all.

#### **WWDC**

And now we have another World Wide Developers Conference behind us. I think it was a good one. Apple announced the new Xserves that are due to ship in a few months. The also announced the new Mac Pro which is ready to ship right now. Some people already have them.

The Mac Pro seems to be a nice system. At first glance, it looks just like the current Mac G5. A quick inspection shows the ability to have dual optical drives (great!). And the power cord is now at the top (and yes the power supply is up there also). The side comes off the same way. The inside is very different. Below the power supply/optical bay area are 4 small boxes. These turn out to be drive bays (very similar to the drive bays in the Xserve. The Mac Pro supports up to 4 internal drives (up to 500 GB each). This is really cool. The inside has the two processors which are dual core. It also has 4 PCI Express slots that need no tools to install/remove cards. Two memory expansion cards are below the slots that hold 4 667 MHz DDR2 ECC fully-buffered DIMMs each.

The processors can be 2 GHz, 2.66 GHz and 3 GHz. All three models are dual processor with dual core (essentially 4 processor cores). FireWire 800 is still here (one in front, one in back). So this appears to be the desktop machine we all have been wanting. The 2 GHz, 1 GB model starts at \$2,124. The 2.66 GHz model adds only \$300 (the 3 GHz adds \$1100 to the base price). By the way, the 3 GHz model with 16GBRAM, 2TB disk, NVIDIAQuadro FX 4500 512 MB, dual 30" monitors and Applecare comes to just over \$16,000.

With these 2 products, the entire Apple product line is available on Intel. This is well ahead of Apple's announced plans. And relatively problem free. The press seems to have missed the magnitude of this accomplishment. I remember the transition to PowerPC. This has been much less painful. And the machine really are faster already. We are not having to wait years for the benefit to show.

By the way, Leopard was previewed. Some features look really neat. Time Machine is real cool. The underlying technology of Time Machine is not new or magic. Other OSes have had multiple versions of files in the past. CVS and Subversion are examples of systems for storing histories of text files. Time Machine mixes this with the concept of

backup. Time Machine theoretically allows you get to any file you have had on your system -- even if it has been deleted. The potential is huge. Two things need to be remembered: First, this does not replace backups. All of Time Machines wonder disappears as soon as the hard drive dies. Secondly, Time Machine could easily run you out of disk space. For many files, keeping differences does not consume much space (like text files that change a small amount). Keeping archives of every image could quickly eat up disk space. I am curious to see how this turns out.

Mail gets lots of advancements. Unfortunately, many of them move to fancier mail messages that will result in larger e-mails and challenge classical mail systems and other mail readers.

Dashboard and Spotlight both get enhancements. A tool to create your own widgets has been created for Dashboard. Spotlight extends its search across network-mounted volumes (wonder how much network traffic you generate building the indices?).

iChat gets some cool stuff. You can now put video backdrops behind you (great way to avoid cleaning your room/office). iChat also supports sharing slideshows or Keynote presentations. It also includes the ability share a screen/take over keyboard mouse. Wow, this sounds cools. This should make it much easier to help a friend learn how to do something.

Wait a minute! That last feature sounds familiar. It reminds me of Teleport (we have demonstrated this before). Oh yeah, the Teleport author now works for Apple. Wonder if there is a connection?


Boot Camp, Front Row and Photo Booth will be part of Leopard (I had wondered if some of these might join iLife or start an iMedia package that could also include a PVR).
