August Meeting

Thanks to William Sellers for his presentation on Podcasting last month. Trying to explain what Podcasting is, show what you need and how to do it in under an hour is an impossible goal. I think he did a great job of presenting the basics of each area so that we could better appreciate Podcasting. So, have you been listening to any good Podcasts? I have.

AAPL

This has been a pretty good month for AAPL. Since last month, Apple is up over \$5.00. Today they closed at \$73.50 with a market cap of \$61.66 billion dollars. For comparison, Dell is at \$21.19 with a market cap of \$48.14 billion. At the moment, Apple is worth 20% more than Dell. This is pretty amazing when you think about it. For comparison, Microsoft

has a market cap of \$258 billion. Walmart (who is currently battling Apple) has a market cap of \$198 billion.

Much of this month's rise seems based on speculation of Apple announcing downloadable movies this month. Looks like interesting is still the right adjective to describe Apple and Wall Street.

Walmart and Movies

Rumors are rampant about the possibility of Apple announcing the ability to download movies via iTunes Music Store (iTMS already has music, TV shows, mu-



annual BRMUG picnic. He needs all the help he can get. Of course I am offering extra helpings to everyone who is on my victorious side!


As you see, the picnic has grown into quite an event. Be sure to join us this year and become part of the tradition.

sic videos, Pixar shorts and Podcasts. When are they going to get around to changing the name?) Rumors are very positive that Apple will announce at least downloadable Disney movies (even if no other labels are on board yet). In fact, the rumors are so solid that Walmart has been approaching movie studios and lobbying against the Apple download service. In case you are wondering, Walmart currently sells 40% of all DVDs.

Mac Mini/iMac Updates

Many people were expecting more hardware updates at WWDC (and some were disappointed). And then Apple announced a press conference which started all the speculation over again. And then Apple quietly announced upgrades to the Mac Mini and the iMac without fanfare in advance of the press conference.

The Mac Mini still has 2 models, but both are now dual-core (1.66 GHz or 1.83 GHz with 667 MHz front-side bus). Default memory is 512 MB of PC2-5300 (upgradable to 2 GB). Hard drives are SATA and range from 60 GB to 160 GB. And the prices remained the same. To get a dual core processor at the same price as a single core is a nice boost by Apple.

The iMac got a speed bump (Available speeds are 1.83, 2.0, 2.16 and 2.33 GHz dual core). Memory is also PC2-5300 (512 MB on low-end with 1 GB standard on higher -end models). Max memory is now 3 GB with the 2 slots. Hard drives are SATA and vary from 160 GB to 500 GB. The bottom end 17" iMac now starts at \$999. The real news was the announcement of the new 24" model (iMac is now available in 17", 20" and 24") for as little as \$1999 with 1 GB RAM, 250 GB hard drive at 2 GHz.

Software Choices

You might wonder about this months meeting topic. While trying to decide what idea was in the best interest of the members, we rejected numerous topics. We settled on this topic because it is something many folks take for granted (from either direction). Lots of new Mac OS X users may not be aware how many choices exist. Long time users may know some of the obvious choices but may not know just how versatile the software selection for the Mac has become.

For example, many of us use Safari every day. Some prefer to use Firefox or Camino or Opera. Some choose to use multiple browsers each day. All are good, free browsers. Firefox provides a lot of customizations and control not available on other browsers. Camino takes some of the benefits of Firefox and blends it with the Mac look and feel. Opera concentrates on maintaining standards compliance and speed.

Each of them has their place. Each of them displays pages a little differently. Printing of pages varies dramatically.

The same is true for e-mail. Mail has some really neat features. But Entourage is the Microsoft standard (which brings numerous benefits and risks). Eudora is the favorite of a lot of folks. Thunderbird brings the browser to e-mail (based on same engine as Firefox). Pine provides a very low level, no frills text-only e-mail interface. Each has their place.

iChat has tremendous features and just works. But talking to Yahoo or MSN users just can't be done. Adium is a great client that talks to just about anything, but lacks the video chat feature.

If you work mostly with other Mac OS X people, then you can be quite happy with the Apple supplied products. As you interact with Windows and Linux users, you sometimes encounter issues that are easiest to solve

by using a different product (a web site may be unreadable with Safari but look fine with Firefox).

Firefox or Thunderbird have another large advantage -- you can use them on any of the three major platforms with very few differences. If you use multiple OSes every day, having consistent applications may be worth a lot to you.

If Microsoft products are used primarily by the folks you exchange with, then using Entourage might be the simplest answer.

So how do you know which one is right for you? You can try each of the possible products yourself and reach a conclusion. You could take somebody else's word for it. Or you could come to this month's meeting and let us demonstrate some of the advantages and disadvantages for you so that you can reach your own conclusion. At the very least you may that having some other applications installed increases your options.
