AAPL

The stock market cooled off some. After AAPL hit am all time high of \$148.92 it has dropped to under \$130. Market Cap is currently just below \$110 billion. For a little while Apple was larger than HP (market wise). Although HP has gone done some, it has not dropped as much as Apple has in the last 2 weeks (making it again larger than Apple).

The iPhone did much better than expected. The iMac and MacMini lines were just updated. iWork finally got the long awaited spreadsheet and iLife just had a major new release. And AAPL went down. I still do not believe that \$150 is impossible by the end of the summer (I may have to tweak the definition of the end of the summer a little).






in Apple's tough times and is a place to celebrate Apple's successes (like the new iPhone!).



New iMacs

After numerous rumors, Apple released the new iMac. It now has an aluminum case like the Pro models. The 17" model has been discontinued. Prices for the 20" start at \$1199. The 24" model starts at \$1799.

Clock speeds range from 2 to 2.8 GHz. Default memory is now 1 GB (upgradeable to 4 GB). Hard drives range from 250 GB to 1 TB. Video is the ATI Radeon HD 2400/2600 video card with 128 MB/256 MB of video RAM.

The entry level iMac is only available with up to a 500 MB drive (a lot for an entry level). The faster 20" is available with up to 750 GB. Seeing the 1 TB drive offered in the 24" was pretty amazing (1 TB drives are just hitting the market in the last month or two). The Mac Pro does not yet offer this as an option!

The new iMacs are slimmer than the previous generation. A visit to one of the web sites showing disassembly is very interesting.

The iMac also has a new keyboard that is slimmer. The keys do not travel as far as on current Apple keyboards. Time will tell if the new keyboard is as durable as its predecessors.

New MacMinis

The MacMini got a modest speed boost with no change in price. Both models now use the Core 2 Duo processor (\$599 for 1.83 GHz with 80 GB hard drive and \$799 for 2.0 GHz with 120 GB hard drive). Both models now include 1 GB or RAM.

Airport Extreme Upgrade

The Airport Extreme base station retains its \$179 price but now adds gigabit ethernet.

iWork Updated

I was wrong on this one. I did not expect this update until after Leopard shipped. For \$79 iWork includes enhanced versions of Keynote and Pages. It also finally gains Numbers (spreadsheet program). All three products promise to import and export Microsoft Office documents (including 2007 format). At this price, with the addition of Numbers and the claimed Office file exchange, iWork is a real bargain (I can remember a time when you paid more just for a conversion program).

iLife Updated

iLife also got an update. No new products were added, but iMovie got a total remake. It appears to be simpler now and has better support for HD cameras. Some are complaining that simpler means less features. iPhoto was also enhanced in this release.

.Mac Updated

Apple announced changes to .Mac. It now includes 10 GB of storage. It also has a new

section called Web Gallery (for sharing iLife productions). The price remained \$99 for a year. Mac is starting to become a decent value. With 10 Gb of storage, reasonable transfer limits, e-mail, Web Gallery, synchronization and backup capability the \$99 a year is not unreasonable (\$79 from Amazon I believe). Apple reports that 1.7 million

.Mac accounts have been sold.

3 Billion

The iTunes Store has topped 3 billion song downloads. The iTunes store now has over 5 million songs, 550 TV shows, and 500 movies. It is ow the third largest music retailer in the US (just passed Amazon and Target).
